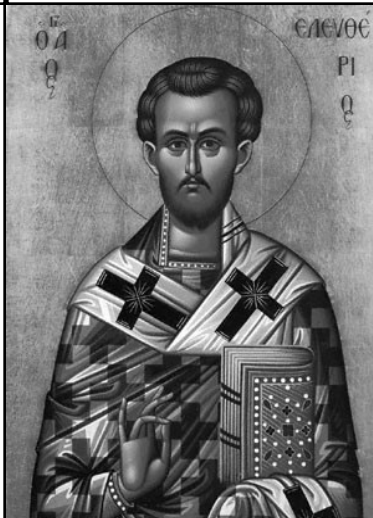
Eleutherios the Holy Martyr, Bishop  
 Illyria and his mother Anthia December 15

**December 2010**

**Apolytikion:** Adorned with flowing priestly vesture and with dripping streams of blood you at once went to your Lord Christ, O blessed wise Eleftherios, annihilator of Satan. Wherefore, do not cease to intercede for those who honor your blessed struggles in faith.

**Kontakion:** O venerable One, we all praise and entreat you, Eleftherios, Priest-Martyr, comeliness of Priests and exaltation of champions. Deliver from diverse dangers those fervently honoring your memory, interceding unceasingly for us all.

This Saint had Rome as his homeland. Having been orphaned of his father from childhood, he was taken by his mother Anthia to Anicetus, the Bishop of Rome (some call him Anencletus, or Anacletus), by whom he was instructed in the sacred letters (that is, the divine Scriptures). Though still very young in years, he was made Bishop of Illyricum by reason of his surpassing virtue, and by his teachings he converted many unbelievers to Christ. However, during a most harsh persecution that was raised against the Christians under Hadrian (reigned 117-138), the Saint was arrested by the tyrants. Enduring many torments for Christ, he was finally put to death by two soldiers about the year 126. As for his Christ-loving mother Anthia, while



embracing the remains of her son and kissing them with maternal affection, she was also beheaded.

From heaven to earth a great peace and love shall come our way, as we prepare for the holy feast of our Lord's Holy Nativity. What we experience, in the very depths of our soul, is the result of a two-way action on the part of our loving God: Our fathers - the saints and the martyrs - have passed from this earthly existence to heaven, and this is because our Lord "God and Savior Jesus Christ came to earth from the heavenly realm, to save us and lead us to His Kingdom.

This is indeed a holy time for all of us as we prepare for our Lord's Holy Nativity. It is a time to pray and a time to fast. It is a time to go to Holy Confession and take Holy Communion. And it is a time to think about how we are to celebrate this great and holy feast day spiritually. All of heaven itself is in a state of great wonder and rejoicing at the Lord's Incarnation. Just think what a blessing, what great kindness and what an unsurpassable act of love it is for us that the Mighty Lord God came - and still comes - to earth from heaven, His Kingdom, to guide us on the path towards our salvation. As our Gracious Lord God comes to us while we are still on this earth, we must surely wonder how we should draw near to Him. Can we come to Him with the same love that He is offering us? Or will we be so busy trying to buy gifts and spending so much time at holiday gatherings that we really forget that indeed a Holy, Mighty, and Immortal God is being born for our sakes? We remember from the Holy Scriptures how our Lord Jesus Christ was born, and came and lived among us. ## AHEPA Marrow Donor Registry

Hello!

My name is Sophia Venetos and I am with the AHEPA Marrow Donor Registry. Our mission is to add persons of Greek descent into our database of prospective donors. The best chance for a leukemia patient is from a family member, secondly from relatives, and then from their ethnic group.

From March 9-13, 2011 we will be hosting our third annual AHEPA Marrow National Invitational Basketball Tournament. There, Pan-Orthodox teams from all around the United States and Canada compete for an excellent cause, as our tournaments motto is, **A Tournament that Saves Lives**.

Please consider passing on this information to your churches Athletic Director or anyone that you think would be interested in possibly participating or submitting an advertisement. We waive the entrance fee for any teams coming from out of state, and we have been able to get them a discounted rate at a 5-star hotel (around \$89 per night).

The goals of the tournament are to promote education, raise awareness of the marrow transplant process, recruit eligible donors and serve as a national fundraising event. We have several divisions, including Mens, Senior Men's, Womens, Boys High School, Boys 15 and Under and Grammar School. We hold a 3-point shooting contest, in which the proceeds are donated to a worthwhile Hellenic cause. Two years ago, the funds were donated to Niko Bezanis, a boy who had a diving accident, which resulted in him becoming a paraplegic. Last year, we donated the funds to a young boy with neuroblastoma. Were happy to say that he is now in remission!

During the tournament, we conduct drives in an attempt to find potential donors for individuals with cancer. A few years ago, a match was found for a young Greek woman and her life was saved. It only takes one to save a life!
